Be a voice for your community

Want to **stand up** for where you live or work and make real changes?

If you are over 18, then you are probably eligible to be a **Parish Councillor** for the parish where you live or work, tackling issues that matter to your local area – like the provision of leisure facilities, youth projects, community centres and community transport.

There are just over 200 parish and town councils in Derbyshire. Councils strive to provide services efficiently and are many are ready to take on delegated powers from other tiers of local government. Responsibilities can vary from parish to parish, but other services they can take on include street lighting, parks and open spaces, public toilets, festivals and celebrations and planning.

Parish councillors meet regularly to make decisions on the work of the council and they answer to their local electorate. Attending a council meeting is the best way of finding out what they do, so give the council a call and find out when its next public meeting is.

Derbyshire's town and parish councils will be holding their next elections on
2nd May 2019.

If you wish to stand you need to submit your **nomination by 4pm on 3rd April 2019** to your local District or Borough Council elections officer.
